COURSE DURATION

On Campus Training

2 Classes Per Week | 80 Weeks

Training Component – Four terms (10-week blocks per term). Two (2) on campus classes per week 6:00pm – 9:00pm

COURSE DELIVERY

This course will be delivered two (2) years part time during school, followed by two (2) years full time post-school in both on and off the job training. Students must undertake a minimum of 100 days in paid employment during school and formal training.

This course is delivered via face-to-face teaching, demonstration, and practical application. Students experience a simulated workplace environment, with access to equipment, products and facilities reflecting industry practice.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students need to demonstrate the Learning, Literacy and Numeracy skills required for this course prior to course commencement.

Students must be over 16 years of age and have a host employer and be enrolled in school.
